BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

The Circuit is the IT Association for the Cincinnati Region. The Circuit unites IT solution and service providers, corporate IT departments, and the businesses that support them. The purpose of The Circuit Scholarship is to promote the study of computer-related subjects by students in the Greater Cincinnati area by granting scholarships to local students who have demonstrated an aptitude and interest in these fields and who have a desire to establish a career in the region.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Recipients must:

- Be a resident of the Greater Cincinnati Metropolitan area (defined as Hamilton, Brown, Butler, Clermont, and Warren counties in Ohio; Kenton, Boone, and Campbell counties in Kentucky; and Dearborn County in Indiana).

EITHER

- Be a graduating high school senior entering a two-year or four-year college or university in the Greater Cincinnati Metropolitan area Fall 2011; demonstrate a proven ability in a computer-related area and have a declared college major in a field relating to computers, such as Computer Science, etc. (see listing of local University/College majors).

OR

- Be a currently enrolled student in two-year or four-year college or university in the Greater Cincinnati Metropolitan area for Fall 2011; in good academic standing; and have a declared major in a field relating to computers, such as Computer Science, Information Systems, etc. (page 2 - local University/College majors).

TO APPLY

1. Complete **The Circuit** Scholarship Application
2. Provide a letter that in your own voice that tells the Scholarship Committee about you: what led you to IT field, your accomplishments to date, your interests and goals for the future.
3. Provide (2) two letters of reference from teacher, faculty, or employer that speak to the general character of student and computer technical ability.

DEADLINE, PROCESS AND AWARD AMOUNTS

- All materials must be received by **The Circuit** no later than 5pm on **December 31, 2010**
- **Process:** application materials will be reviewed for completeness, read and evaluated by The Circuit scholarship committee.
- Scholarships will each be awarded through the appropriate college/university financial aid office or bursar's office in the winter of 2010 for the 2011-2012 school year.
